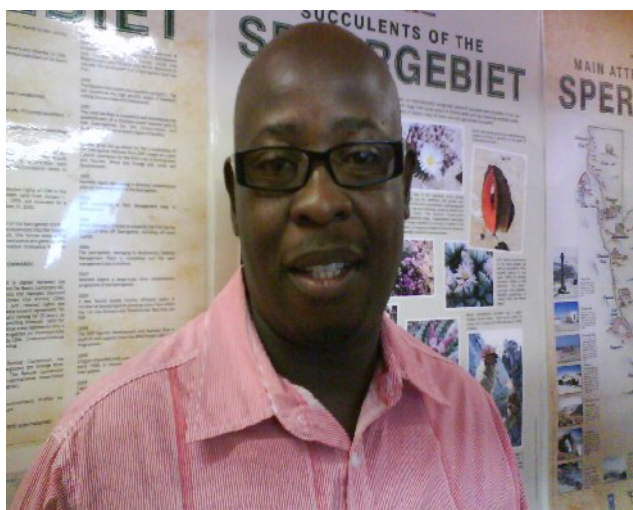

Cultural Centre (FNCC) in conjunction with the Strengthening the Protected Area Network (SPAN) Project is hosting a lecture based on the works of Karl Aribeb, who conducted a case study of /Ai - /Ais /Richtersveld Transfrontier Conservation Areas (TFCA).

This Transformer Park was established by governments of Namibia and South Africa and seeks to provide for joint management of Richtersveld National Park (RSA) and /Ai /Ais HOT Springs Game Park (Namibia). ARTFP is one of the three TFCAs that Namibia participates in and is the furthest developed of the three. Directorate of Parks and Wildlife Management leads MET's efforts in this bilateral initiative.

Preparatory work for establishing ARTFP Park started way back in 2000 and gained momentum with the signing of an MOU by the respective Ministers responsible for environment (Hon. Malima Filemon Malima and Hon. Vall Moosa) on 17th August 2001.
